LECTURER POSITION IN INFORMATION SYSTEMS

The Department of Information Systems and Operations Management (ISOM) in the Warrington College of Business Administration at the University of Florida is inviting applications for one Lecturer position starting August 2011. Candidates are required to have a Ph.D. degree in Information Systems or a closely related area. Prior teaching experience at the graduate level is necessary – preferably in information systems. The incumbent will be required to teach an electronic platform course (both semesters) in our undergraduate program and three modular courses per year in the MS ISOM degree program. This teaching load translates into the standard 6 sections required by the College of Business Administration for this position. The salary will be in the range \$70,000-\$90,000 for the 9 month academic year.

Our department currently offers undergraduate, masters and Ph.D. programs in ISOM and we are currently the fastest growing department in the Warrington College of Business Administration. The faculty members in our department are well known researchers with interests in Operations Management, Information Systems, Management Science, and Decision Theory.
