CALL FOR PAPERS

The New Zealand and Australian Women in Information Technology (NZ_OzWIT) conference aims at gathering high-quality contributions to the women in computing area of research. Papers for NZ_OzWIT will be **double blind peer reviewed**.

We will accept **Research Papers, Posters and proposals for Panels**.

Research papers can be 6 to 8 pages in length and should have:

- a clear theoretical basis building on existing literature
- a strong empirical basis drawing on relevant research methods
- an explanation of the paper's impact and or contribution to the existing women in computing literature.

All papers should follow the ACM SIGCSE formatting guidelines. Templates for submissions can be found at the ACM SIG Proceedings website.

Panels discussing relevant and important issues related to the conference themes of:

Panel proposals should include title, abstract and short bio of each panel member. Industry, professional and academic panels are welcomed.

Posters of work in progress and student research are also encouraged.
