How to Submit Papers

charlesamasango@yahoo.com) on or before April 30th 2014. ICT4Africa 2014 consortium submissions, publication and editorial committee will maintain very strict rules on submissions formats and deadlines. Papers which fail to use the formats will be rejected without review.

Authors should submit their electronic article on word. The full **title** of the article should be supplied on the **title page.** The article should be **typed** in Times New Roman in 12 – point font size, in double-spacing (including all notes and references), on one side of the paper only. The **length** of an article is between 5,000 and 8,000 words. All notes should be kept to a minimum and appear at the end of the article before the **list of references. Figures and tables should be embedded in the text.**

A structured **abstract** of 300 words in length, covering the main factual points and statement of objective or problem, method, result and conclusion, should accompany your article including a list of at least four **keywords** for abstracting and indexing services.

A formal notification of paper acceptance will only be issued after authors have addressed reviewer's comments as recommended by the review process. For papers to appear in the proceedings, at least one author must register and pay the registration fee applicable to his/her presentation. Letters of Invitation to ICT4Africa 2014 will only be issued after author(s) registration has been confirmed. An online and hard copy version of the peer reviewed conference proceedings for all tracks and submissions shall be made available. Authors of some selected papers will be requested to submit extended versions of their work for publication in an edited book and Special issue of the African Journal of Information Systems dedicated to ICT4Africa after the conference. For consideration for the best paper award in any of the submission categories, full manuscript must be submitted by April 30th 2014.
