Preparation of Manuscript

Authors have to submit their manuscripts in the JRCT Paper format. Submissions must include in order of title, authors name and affiliation's, email addresses, abstract, keywords, Introduction, Experimental, Results and Discussion, Conclusion, References. Please indicate the corresponding author with " * ". After preparation of the manuscript, submit it to jrctonline@gmail.com

Acceptance Notification

Within 3 to 5 days from the date of manuscript submission. Authors of accepted papers would be informed about the review results after completion of the review process. Authors submitting a revised manuscript need to outline separately the response to the reviewer's comments including changes introduced to the manuscript. The authors have to submit a camera ready copy of the manuscript. The authors also need to submit the completed copyright form.

Publication of Manuscripts

Manuscripts will publish within 5 days from the date of payment.

Type of Manuscripts

Full Length text research papers, short communications, short research articles are accepted

Manuscript should be typed in Times New Roman font of 12 in double space. Titles should be in a font size 14 with bold face capitals. Subtitles should be in font size 12 with bold face.

Manuscript should be presented on A-4 size, with sufficient margins on all the sides. Manuscript should be arranged with each of the following on a separate page.

1. Title page

In separate lines, title page should contain the title of the manuscript, the name(s) and affiliation(s) of the author(s), and the mailing address, telephone and fax numbers, and e-mail address of the corresponding author. The title must be specific, concise and informative.

2. Abstract and Keywords

Full-length manuscript submission should contain an abstract of up to 250 words. Please include 3–10 keywords for indexing purposes.

3. Introduction and Experimental

It should summarize the rationale, provides a concise research background (not an exhaustive review) and states in single sentence the objective of the study. Please do not include any results or the conclusions of the study.

4. Results and Discussion

It is preferred to discuss all the results in detail in case of original research paper. To explain observed data you can use figures, graphs and tables with suitable No's.

5. Conclusion

A conclusion might elaborate on the importance of the work or suggest applications and extensions.

6. References

List and number all bibliographical references in 9-point Times, single-spaced, at the end of your paper. When referenced in the text, enclose the citation number in square brackets, for example [1]. Where appropriate, include the name(s) of editors of referenced books. The template will number citations consecutively within brackets [1]. The sentence punctuation follows the bracket [2]. Refer simply to the reference number, as in [3]-do not use "Ref. [3]" or "reference [3]" except at the beginning of a sentence: "Reference [3] was the first . . ." Number footnotes separately in superscripts. Place the actual footnote at the bottom of the column in which it was cited. Do not put footnotes in the reference list. Use letters for table footnotes. Unless there are six authors or more give all authors' names; do not use "et al.". Papers that have not been published, even if they have been submitted for publication, should be cited as "unpublished" [4]. Papers that have been accepted for publication should be cited as "in press" [5]. Capitalize only the first word in a paper title, except for proper nouns and element symbols. For papers published in translation journals, please give the English citation first, followed by the original foreign-language citation [6].
