Referring to the University call Ref. No. 20141228, two positions and scholarships are available as of September 2015 for a duration of four years. Successful candidates will be enrolled in MU's PhD in Business and Socioeconomic Sciences and use about 50% of their working hours (40h per week) for their PhD studies. The starting salary is EUR 25,000 before taxes (the annual teaching load is two units à 45 minutes of weekly teaching). From the second year onwards, the salary increases to EUR 32,800 with an annual teaching load of six units per semester. Additional allowances are available; tuition for the PhD program (EUR 11,250 per year) is covered by MU Vienna.
