HICSS 2016 Minitrack: "Taking the measure of the internet"

January 5-8, 2016

This half-day minitrack is to present new research on how to assess the internet in ways that are significant for information systems and systems sciences. This is an area of great relevance in the current discussions on the internet future. We intend to create a coherent program that will allow for informed debate and discussion about topics including:

- How the internet can be measured and monitored in ways that best reveal its characteristics relevant for business models, systems design and management
- How the internet can be measured and monitored to further good governance and the public interest.
- What differences are relevant among different countries and regions that distinguish unique characteristics of the architecture, governance or use of the internet.
- How different business strategies adapt to changes in the shape and usage of the internet.
- What measurable relationships exist among architecture, governance and use that affect investment.
- What measurable relationships exist among architecture, governance and use that affect economic externalities.
- What is the current state of internet data analytics?
- The significance of metrics for internet governance, innovation and modularity.
- How measurable changes in architecture near the edge affect business strategies and investment.

We will endeavor to provide a fast track for best papers to a journal, and for this we have already contacted a few journals.

Deadlines:

June 15: Submit full manuscripts for review. The review is double-blind; therefore this submission must be without author names.

August 15: Acceptance notices are emailed to authors by the Review System. At least one author of each accepted paper must immediately make plans to attend the conference, including initiating fiscal, visa, or other travel guarantees.

September 15: Accepted authors submit Final Paper. Early Registration fee

deadline. At least one author of each paper should register by Sept 15 in order to secure publication in the Conference Proceedings.
