

Telfer School of Management and the University of Ottawa Faculty Position in Healthcare Analytics

The Telfer School of Management at the University of Ottawa is seeking faculty candidates at the Assistant Professor rank in the field of health systems commencing July 1, 2016.

The University of Ottawa, a top-ten research-intensive university in Canada, is committed to becoming a globally recognized institution in management. With highly ranked Faculties of Medicine, Engineering and Law, along with an internationally accredited School of Management, many of the structures are already in place. The Telfer School has prioritized health systems and business analytics as two of its strategic areas of expertise that differentiate it from other business schools nationally and internationally. In particular, our health systems sector benefits from strong connections to the local health authority, health research institutes, and the hospitals in the region through the Telfer Health Transformation Exchange initiative – an organization designed to bring health practitioners and academics together. Faculty members are also actively involved in a research-based Master of Science in Health Systems program and in a PhD program to start in the Fall of 2016.

Title of the position: Professor in healthcare analytics at the rank of Assistant Professor.

Duties: As a member of the academic staff, your duties will include in varying proportions: a) teaching activities; b) scholarly activities; c) academic service activities; and d) supervision of graduate students.

Terms: Tenure-track position.

Wage: Salary typically starts at \$115,000 per year and is commensurate with qualifications and experience. Benefits also include a start-up period with a reduced teaching load and start-up funding for research.

Benefit package: The University of Ottawa provides a complete compensation package, which includes long-term disability, basic group life insurance, supplementary health insurance, a University of Ottawa pension plan and optional life insurance.

A successful candidate must demonstrate the following qualifications:

- Ph.D. in operations and logistics, data sciences, industrial engineering, applied computer science, health systems performance or related discipline;
- Evidence of research in healthcare analytics domain;
- Strong evidence of quality research productivity through research publications.

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- Evidence of an ability to mentor students and successfully compete for funding is an asset.
- Strong fit with the Health Systems sector and Telfer faculty;
- Understanding of the healthcare sector and health systems research preferably with some experience working in and with health organizations;
- Some university teaching experience is an asset.

Application deadline: Applications received prior to **May 15, 2016** will be given first consideration. Applications received after that date will be considered until the position is filled.

Applications must contain: 1) a letter of intent, 2) a curriculum vitae, 3) a brief research statement, 4) a brief statement of teaching philosophy, 5) recent teaching evaluation reports and 6) three letters of recommendation sent under separate cover by the due date.
