**To submit your article,** log into <u>Meteor</u>, Springer Nature's submission platform for major reference works. Use the token link given in your e-mail invitation to generate your password to log into the system.

#### Please keep the following in mind while preparing your contributions.

- 1. Scientific Level of Your Contribution Reference content is tertiary in nature, and therefore should not be written as a research paper. It should contain easily accessible, synthesized and established knowledge. Therefore, your contribution should be clear and concise and be a comprehensive and up-to-date overview of your topic. Also, define and explain all specialized terminology and avoid technical jargon whenever possible, as this work is aimed at undergraduate and postgraduates in the academics and professionals from the various disciplines and industries who are interested in applying knowledge of this work in their respective fields. Acronyms and abbreviations should be defined at first mention.
- 2. Length of Contribution: Your contribution should have a length of about 2500-4000 words.

### 3. Structure of Your Contribution:

- Article title (and subtitle if needed)
- Author information (including co-authors: name, complete affiliation, city, country, e-mail address)
- Synonyms (if any)
- Definition (of entry term)
- Overview
- Key Research Findings
- Examples of Application
- Future Directions for Research
- References (up to 50, see Section 4, below)
- Cross-References (see Section 5)

## AVOID

**Brand/Product Endorsement:** Exclude any form of brand promotion or advertising from your contribution. For a detailed explanation and list of examples, download the file "Brand Endorsements\_Examples, Dos & Don'ts" from the project website: <u>https://meteor.springer.com/bdt</u>

**Footnotes & Endnotes (including Acknowledgments):** Exclude these print-page formatting conventions which pose a formatting problem (i.e., footnotes are not easily accessible in digital version of this publication). Incorporate footnotes into the text if these are important information or cut them if not.

**First-Person Usage:** Exclude such first-person pronouns as "I," "We," "ours," "us" to maintain the tertiary nature of this publication and a neutral voice in your chapter.

#### PAY ATTENTION TO

**Contribution Title:** Follow the contribution title in your invitation e-mail. To change it, first seek approval from your (section) editor, keeping Springer in copy. For your contribution to be found online (i.e., on search engines), use the right keywords that best describe it. An effective title should be neither too long nor too short. For tips on improving contribution titles for search engine optimization, download the file "**SEO Tips for Handbooks and Encyclopedias**" from the project website: <u>https://meteor.springer.com/bdt</u>

Name & Affiliation: This metadata for all authors in your contribution should appear at the beginning and will be captured separately. Avoid adding your name and other parts of your affiliation into the running text. Co-authors: You may invite colleagues, preferably up to two, to act as co-authors. Indicate clearly the corresponding author (who will receive the proof to check) and the author order.

#### 4. Citations and References

In-text citations should follow the NameYear system. See following for examples:

- 1. One author: (Dubois 1999).
- 2. Two authors: (Miller and Smith 2001).
- 3. More than two authors: (Miller et al. 1999).
- 4. Multiple citations are separated by semicolons and listed first alphabetically, then chronologically: (Vallejo 1990; Vallejo and Smith 1995).
- 5. When two or more works by the same author have the same publication date, distinguish them in the order in which they appear in the text, with letters following the date: (Kruger 1997a, 1997b, 1996).

## 5. Cross-References

Please login to the project website on Meteor to view the current table of contents. Include a list of related articles that may be of further interest to your readers.

# 6. Figures and Tables

- Color figures can be submitted. All figures and illustrations will appear in color online and in print.
- Figures should always be submitted as separate image files in any one of these five standard formats: JPG/JPEG, GIF, PNG, EPS, or TIFF. The minimum resolution should be 300 dpi for photographs, 1,200 dpi for drawings. Please do not use figures downloaded from the Internet as the resolution would not be high enough.
- Indicate clearly the placement of figures/tables in your article text.
- Number your figures/tables consecutively in the order these appear in the article (e.g., Fig. 1, Fig. 2 or Table 1, Table 2).
- Insert an explanatory legend of all figures/tables at the end of the article.

# 7. Copyright & Permissions

Authors are responsible for sourcing figures, obtaining the necessary permission to use them, and any associated fees. All figures and graphics should be original. While using figures/tables or any other material from other sources, please request permission from the copyright holder (usually the publishing house or author) to use them. The permission form for your use and the copyright and permission FAQs can be found on <a href="https://meteor.springer.com/bdt">https://meteor.springer.com/bdt</a>.

### 8. Submission Platform & Due Date

In order to publish this book as soon as possible and to keep all contributions up-to-date, please upload your final manuscript within the **deadline** mentioned in your **invitation e-mail**. To upload your files, log into <u>Meteor</u>. All submitted articles will be reviewed.
