The Security of Employment series requires, in addition to excellent teaching and service, externally recognized professional and scholarly achievement in the candidate's specific discipline and/or of pedagogy.

We are seeking individuals with a commitment to excellence in teaching and research (academic, professional, and/or pedagogic) in Information Systems and in service to the University and the academy. Preference may be given to candidates who are qualified to teach courses in advanced data analytics (e.g. machine learning, natural language processing, and big data management). Evidence of or the potential for excellent teaching in the MBA core is desirable. A Ph.D. in Information Systems or relevant discipline, completed by Summer 2018, is required. Salary will be commensurate with qualifications and experience.
